

The Municipal Bill

The seventh regular meeting of the Citizens' Committee took place last night in the Board of Trade Rooms, the attendance being fairly large. The Secretary read the minutes of the last meeting which were adopted Mr. Alex. Mews asked if any reply Mr. Alex. Mews asked if any reply in relation to the committee's expenditure had been received from the Premier. The Chairman's reply was. "No." Mr. Mews suggested that the bills be certified by the Cheirman, and handed to the Municipal Board for payment. Mr. Summers was of the opinion that the committée's expenditure should be shouldered by the representatives of St. John's East and West, who called the first meeting of citizens in the T.A. Hall. He also proposed that the Colonial Secretary be written in relation to the matter. The Bill was then taken up, and Section 2 to Section 8 were discussed. Mr. Kelly objected to allowing landlords to rent basements in houses as sleeping rooms. Mr. Bradley spoke on the black smoke section, and proposed that the word vapour be added.
