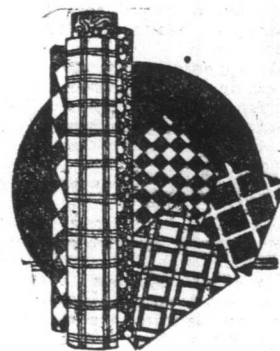

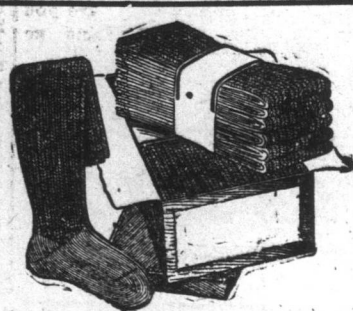

NOT MUCH DAMAGE.

LONDON, Oct. 6.
A despatch to Lloyd's from Hamburg says that but one room above the engine store-room on the great steamship Bismarck, was destroyed by fire, which broke out on the vessel on Tuesday.

"VENGEANCE GANG" IN THE TOILS

CAIRO, Egypt, Oct. 6.
Twenty five members of the so called "vengeance gang" alleged to be an anti-British Society, organized to conduct assassinations of political personages, have been convicted of conspiracy by a court before which they had been on trial for several weeks. The sentences will be promulgated later.

REVOLUTIONARY STRIKE IN PORTUGAL.

LONDON, Oct. 6.
The Madrid Correspondent of Reuters Limited says that intelligence from various points of the frontier indicates that a general strike, apparently of a revolutionary character, has broken out in the whole of Portugal.

POLITICAL MAGAZINE.

LONDON, Oct. 6.
The first number of "new Lloyd's George Liberal Magazine" which is to be issued monthly, with the object of supporting the Governments policy, appears to-morrow. It contains a special interview with the Premier devoted to a defense of the coalition Government. Incidentally, Lloyd's George professes the belief that the United States will formally join the League of Nations after the election, and asserts that when Germany also enters, which will be as soon as she gives proof of her good faith, the League will become an effective instrument, instead of as now, a mere League of the Allies.

INFANTRY OFFICER MURDERED.

LONDON, Oct. 7.
Lieutenant Lamie of an infantry regiment was shot dead by unknown persons at Collinstown airdrome, County Dublin, Wednesday, says a despatch to the Daily Mail.

ENGINEER FIRED ON.

CORK, Oct. 7.
Third engineer Russell of the United States steamer, West Kader, was shot through the right shoulder last night, while returning to his ship. Russell says it was an expanding soft nosed bullet that struck him. He heard no challenge, but three shots were fired at him and his companion.

FOR A PROPER PURPOSE.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.
The recent shipment of the first Russian gold to enter United States since nineteen sixteen, was imported "for an entirely proper commercial purpose," according to the Department of Justice, which has investigated. The shipment, aggregating three hundred and thirty nine thousand dollars had come into the country with the knowledge and consent of the authorities.

CARDS ON THE TABLE.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.
Adequate world trade development by Great Britain and United States requires that both Nations lay their cards on the table. Sir Auckland Geddes, British Ambassador, said yesterday at a dinner given by the Chamber of Commerce of United States to representatives of the British Chamber of Commerce.

WILL BE DEFENDED.

LONDON, Oct. 7.
The Duchess of Marlborough's petition appears in the list of defended cases for hearing before the Divorce Court at an early date.

RETURNED SAFELY.

DUBLIN, Oct. 7.
Two men, kidnapped at Lisdovnerne, on September 20, were returned last night to the hotel from which they were captured.

WILLING TO COMPROMISE.

LONDON, Oct. 7.
Leaders of Sinn Fein have intimated that although they desire complete separation from England, they would not oppose a broad measure of Dominion Home Rule, if it can be proved the majority of the people desire it. says the Daily Mail. This intimation is given to the Irish Peace Council a body of moderates from all parts of Ireland, which has just completed a plan for Dominion Home Rule, says the newspaper. The Council claims to have obtained sufficient support to make the scheme workable, and the Mail asserts will send a deputation to Lloyd George to consider initial steps of the scheme.

WEAK BUT UNCHANGED.

LONDON, Oct. 7.
MacSweeney, on the fifty sixth day of his hunger strike, was very weak but otherwise unchanged, according to a bulletin of the Irish Self Determination League.
