MIDDLE AGE CUSTOMS REVIVED. BELGRADE. (Associated Press.)-All the customs of the romantic days f the Middle Ages were revived for the wedding here June 8 of King Alexander of Jugoslavia and Princess Marie of Rumania. The Rumanian Princess, the most comely and talented of Queen Marie's large family and the third of her children to be married within a year, sailed up the Danube on a gorgeous float to Belgrade, accompanied by the entire Rumanian Family. In the medieval citadel overlooking the river at Belgrade, King Alexander who sought the hand of more than one other Princess before becoming affianced to Princess Marie, met her on horseback. Together they went to the Palace where he presented her to his court. Then the couple drove to the cathedral for the solemn Orthodox Greek religious service. After the ceremony in the cathedral, which was performed by the Serbian Paed before the King and Queen. There were floats and pageants symbolic of Serbia's greatest historic events, going back to the Czar Douchan's game between Belgrade and Bucharover a great part of Europe.
