Less Historical records show that up to H. D. MOREHOUSE, 1822 there were no horses in New England, and their introduction into New Netherlands, now New York, occurred during the administration of Governor von Twillier, 1833-38. Trumbull's History of Connecticut mentions the horse is accompanying emigrants from Massachasetts to that State, October 15th, 1630. The first horse seen in Canada was-brought to that country from France in a ship which arrived at Tadousac, June 20th, 1647. It is estimated that there are now in the United States eight million of horses, valued at between two and three thousand millions of dollars, a sum ample to pay the national debt.
