At the opening of the House on Saturday, Mr. E. B. On the vote for fisheries, Mr. J. Young called attention to the disproportionate sum spent on Nova Scotia fisheries, as compared with the revenue derived therefrom. The wardens and overseers in that Province were, he pointed Mt., more numerous than in any other Province, but the revenue was little or nothing.

In answer to an allusion of the previous speaker, Mr. Mackenzie pointed out that it was not fair to charge Ontario with the whole sum spent in that Province, as a large amount was attributable to the fish-breeding establishment of Mr. Wilmott, whence ova was supplied to the whole Dominion.
