Ontario Government Refuses to Investigate Conditions -Hanna Jeers at Idea.

Toronto, Feb. 24.—After a debate lasting until eleven o'clock tonight, Mr. Rowell's amendment to the address in reply to the speech from the throne calling for the appointment of a minister of labor and an investigation of the condition of the labor and an investigation of the condi-tion of unemployment in Ontario was de-feated by a vote of 58 to 19. Allan Stud-holme, the labor member from East Ham-ilton, voted with the opposition. There were a number of absentees on the Gov-ernment side.

The adjournment of the debate was

moved by Mr. W. Proudfoot (Centre Huron), who will move a further amend-ment on Wednesday regretting the failure of the Government to bring in any anti-treating legislation, and it is ex-pected that a further amendment on tax

anti-treating legislation, and it is expected that a further amendment on tax reform will also be moved.

Hanna Pokes Fun at Suggestion.

Hon. W. J. Hanna, continuing the debate on the address in reply to the speech from the throne, stated that the opposition had not been able to find any cause of "regret" in his honor's speech, and had been forced into new fields to find argument for criticism. They had advocated a minister of health, and a minister of municipal affairs and now wanted a "minister of unemployment." (Laughter.) Mr. Rowell's remarks, he said, had left the impression that conditions in Ontario were worse than actually was the case. With regard to social legislation he said that Ontario was not behind other countries. The workmen's compensation act would be a model for other countries. The public health act had been commended far and wide.

"I want to say this," Mr. Hanna went on. "I do not think the conditions of agriculture in Ontario have ever received greater assistance, greater encouragement, greater help from any government in this Province than they have in recent years and particularly are receiving today under the present minister of agriculture." (Applause.)

Sam Clarke (West Northumberland) prefaced a characteristic reply to Mr. Hanna with a salvo of congratulations to the provincial secretary on his speech, the member for North Lanark (Hon. R. F. Preston) on his elevation to cabinet rank, and Hon. I. B. Lucas on his succession as provincial treasurer.


