Now add a cup of boiling water into which put 1 teaspoon of soda, pour over the above and beat again but just enough to mix, now add 2 cups of flour and 2 teaspoons of baking powder and flavor to suit the taste.

Brinsley Red Cross Union Raises That Sum.

A meeting of the Brinsley Red Cross was held in the St. Mary's Church on Friday, March 24, the last of a series of entertainments carried on during the winter months. The secretary reported that the total proceeds were \$283.88, and the expenses \$74.72. A portion of the proceeds, \$134.25, was spent for yarn and other material and made up for the ladies of the society. The remainder, \$75.55, has been forwarded to the Canadian Red Cross Society.

THE BEAUTY SEEKER.
Superfluous hair is a very annoying blemish, difficult to cure if it has much of a start. It may be removed by the electric needle; the results will be more permanent if you go to the best operators. Peroxide and ammonia is a good home remedy. To an ounce of peroxide, add two drops of what is called ordinary ammonia, or 4-F. Do not on any account use household ammonia, as it may have other preparations in it. The peroxide bleaches the hair so it will not be noticeable, and the ammonia weakens the roots. You may be able to pull some of the hairs out with tweezers, applying an astringent lotion to the spot immediately afterward. — Woman's World for April.
