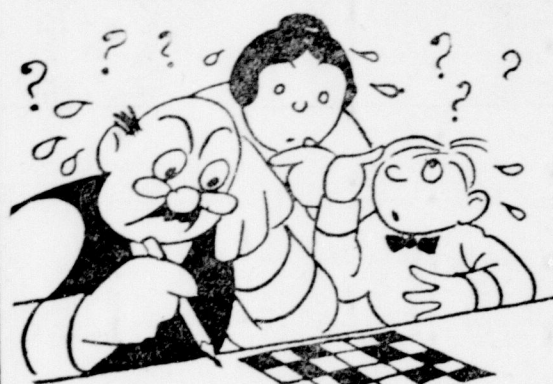


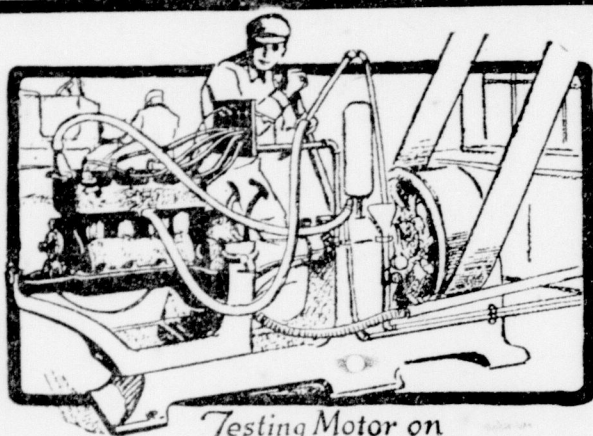

Motor and Transmission Overhaul

Rear Axle Overhaul

Only skilled Ford mechanics should be allowed to overhaul your motor. Only genuine Ford parts should be used. Bring this ad with you and we will:

1. Take down motor; inspect each part thoroughly; test crank case in straightening press, rebabbit and ream main bearings and caps.
2. Fit pistons, piston pins and rings (install over-size pistons or rings if necessary); line up connecting rods in alignment fig.
3. "Run in" crank shaft to a perfect fit on a burning-in machine; assemble motor, regrind valves with special machine and valve seats; time valves up to piston travel.
4. Re-bush worn transmission parts; test magnets; test magneto coil for short circuits; test crank case and re-braze if necessary.
5. Run motor on test block until "broken in," test motor under own power until O. K.

Overhauling the Ford rear axle assembly should be done only by experienced Ford mechanics. Bring this Ad. with you and we will:

1. Take down rear axle assembly, wash and clean all internal parts; carefully inspect each part and replace all worn parts.
2. Test axle shafts and drive shafts.
3. Assemble, adjust and thoroughly grease all internal parts and inclose in housing.
4. Connect axle assembly to car; put on new felts at outer ends of rear axle; equalize and adjust brake rods.
5. Test complete assembly.

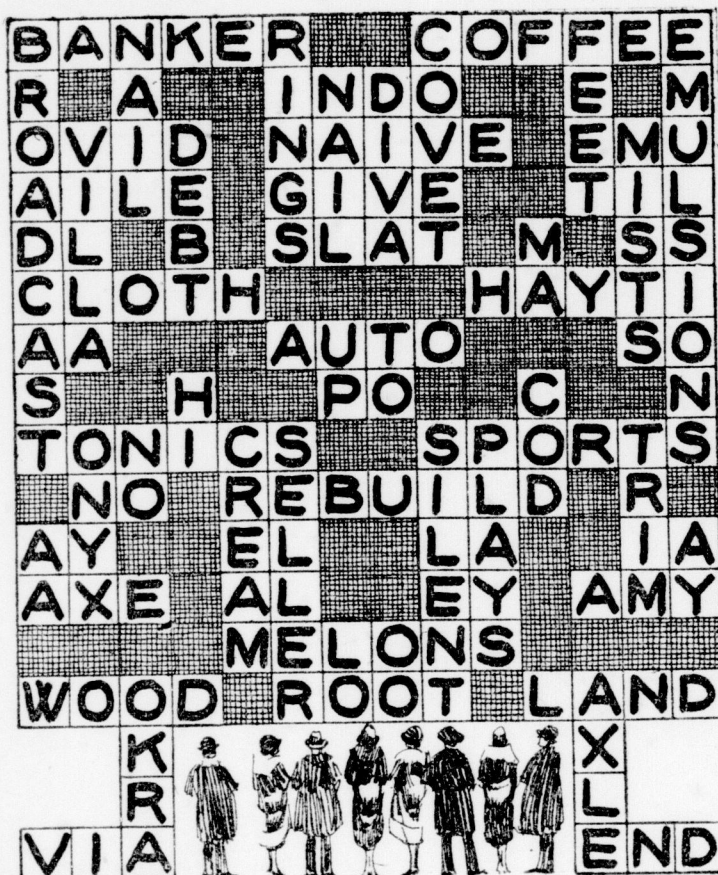

CHINAMAN TEARS UP FORTUNE AND LIFE OF COMFORT FADES

Canadian Press Despatch. Winnipeg, Jan. 23.—Money was one of Jim Lee Quong's least worries and just to prove that it was more of a burden, the Chinese coolie tore up his roll of nearly \$4,000 last night, before a surprised group of onlookers in a Canadian National railway train, a few miles from Winnipeg.

Quong, an old time resident of Toronto, was enroute to China, where he had planned to settle down to a life of ease and comfort. He had worked hard in a Chinese laundry for 20 years, during which time he had saved up a small fortune. Today, the impetuous Quong is gloating over his deed from the inside of a padded cell in the provincial jail, while the authorities are doing their best to piece together the shattered fortune which they believe may come in useful to Quong.

NEARLY 125,000 COME TO CANADA

Immigration Figures for Year Show Slight Decrease—Many From Gt. Britain.

Canadian Press Despatch. Ottawa, Jan. 23.—Immigration to Canada for the calendar year 1924 totalled 124,459 according to an official statement by the department of immigration and colonization. This total is made up of 57,612 from Great Britain and Ireland; 16,328 from the United States and 50,519 from other countries.

In the calendar year for 1923 the total immigration to Canada was 127,329, so that in 1924 there was a decrease of 12,870 or nine per cent. But this total, says the statement, does not take into consideration the 27,317 Canadians who have returned home since April 1, 1924, from the United States after having lived there for six months or longer. It was not till then that the department began to keep a record of these returning Canadians. With these included, the total immigration therefore is 151,771, an increase over 1923 of 24,447.

Immigration from the United States in 1924 was 16,328 compared with 20,307 in 1923, a decrease of 3,979. Here again, however, the statement adds, these figures make no allowance for the movement of 37,317 Canadians returning to Canada since April 1, 1924, from the United States. During last December immigration totalled 2,765. In the same month, 2,195 Canadians returned from the United States.

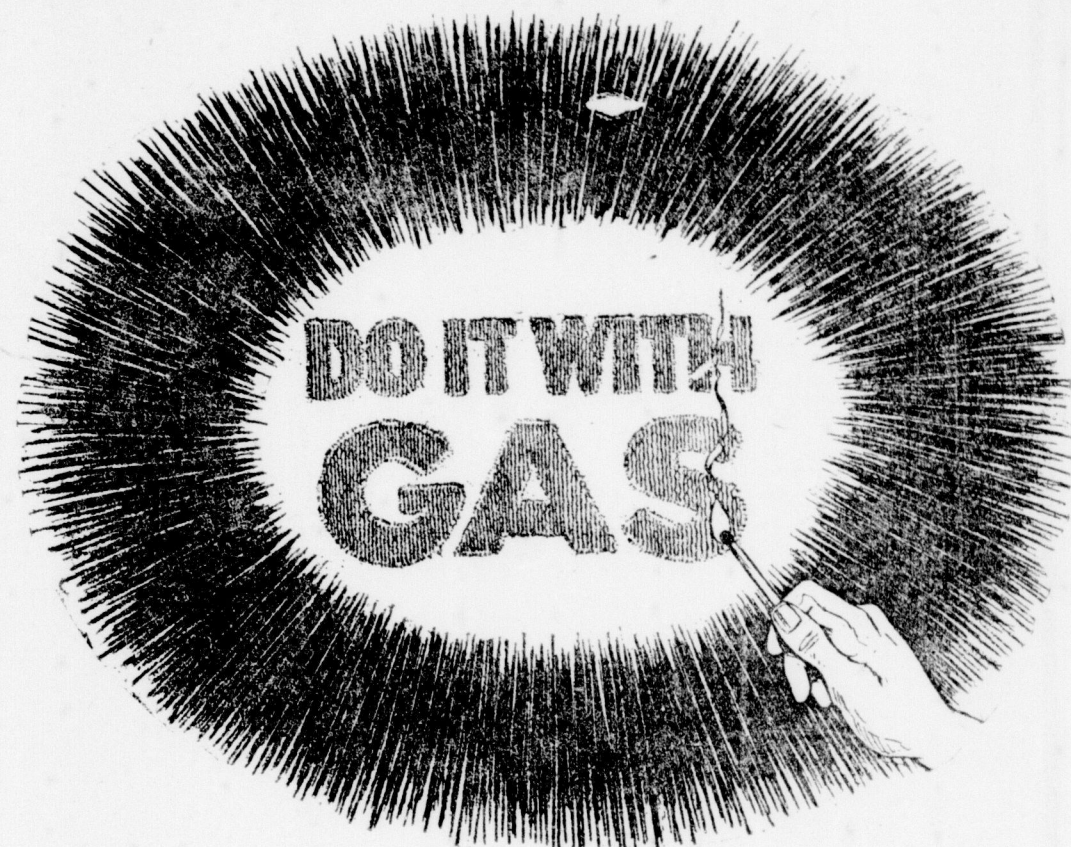
