At the Referendum election there were scores of electors whose names were not on the voters' lists, and although notices have been published in local papers up to noon to-day, Mr. A. G. Adams had only added ten names to the town list.

Campbellton is an urban district and names can only be added by the Registrar up to Saturday evening, Nov. 5th. After that the Registrar, Mr. Colin McKenzie may add names under certain conditions, but it is important that all additions be made this week.

In the rural districts electors may vote by taking a certain oath, even if their names are not on the list, but it is better to have such names properly entered.

Every elector should see that his or her name is on the voters' list.
