SIR HECTOR HAS RESIGNED.

LANGVIN IS NO LONGER MINISTER OF PUBLIC WORKS.

He Swears That He is an Innocent Man and Knew Nothing of the Manipulation of Tenders Nor of Collection of Money. He Says He Never Saw Money for the Three Rivers Election.

OTTAWA, Aug. 11.—Sir Hector Langvin has handed in his resignation as Minister of Public Works. The resignation of Sir Hector is the only one of the kind that has been received by the Prime Minister.

OTTAWA, Aug. 11.—When the order of the day was called in the House of Commons this afternoon Mr. Laurier said he understood that the Minister of Public Works told the Committee on Privileges and Elections this morning that his resignation was accepted.

Mr. Langvin said that the Minister of Public Works tendered his resignation today. No action had been taken on it except that the Minister of Public Works had taken charge of the department.

Hon. Frank Smith will be appointed Acting Minister of Public Works to-morrow.

Sir Hector's Career. Sir Hector is a son of the late Jean Langvin, formerly assistant secretary under Lord Sydenham, while Governor-General of the Province of Ontario.

He was editor of different French papers in Montreal until 1864. He was a member of the Legislative Council, Canada, from March 30, 1864, until the union, and held the office of Solicitor-General from March 30, 1868, to October 10, 1868, and Postmaster-General from October 10, 1868, to May 1, 1869.
