London, Dec. 2.—A dense fog prevailed throughout central and southern England Saturday. River traffic was stopped generally. In London several collisions of vehicles occurred in the afternoon, resulting in some severe injuries. A omnibus fouled a car and 14 occupants were hurled down a steep embankment, the majority being seriously hurt. Several isolated cases are reported in which persons accidentally fell into docks or canals, in consequence of their inability to see through the fog.

**WHEAT MARKETS STRONG.**

A HULLY ON WALL-STREET, WITH SHOWS THE BUTERS.

**Commercial Cable Is Higher To-Day-Large Decrease in Reserves of New York Banks—Local and Foreign Wheat Markets Are Higher—Another Decrease in Liverpool Stocks.**

Saturday, Dec. 1. The local stock market was moderately active to-day, with Cable higher. The best bid for Toronto Street Railway stock is 55.

Consols closed today at 109 5/16 for money and 103 3/8 for account. Canadian Pacific tender, closing in London today at 61 3/8. St. Paul closed at 59. Erie at 12. Reading at 8 and N.Y.C. at 101 1/4.

The bullion in the Bank of England increased 102,262 during the week, and the proportion of reserve to liabilities is 65.33 per cent., as against 64.66 last week, and 60.75 a year ago.

Commercial Cable will on Tuesday declare a quarterly dividend. In spite of rumors to the contrary, it will be 1-4 per cent. The earnings of the cable are not as large as last year, but the decrease is not likely to be over \$100,000.

It is thought by some that the visible supply of wheat on Monday will be very little increase, while others estimate an increase as high as a million bushels. During the corresponding week of last year the increase was 808,000 bushels.

Stocks of wheat at Liverpool 220 to 230,000 qrs., maize 60 to 70,000 qrs., flour 140 to 150,000 barrels. On Nov. 1 the stock of wheat was 180,000 qrs., more, maize 70,000 more and flour 60,000 barrels more. A year ago wheat was 170,000 qrs., maize 70,000 qrs. and flour 100,000 barrels more.

**New York Bank Statement.**  
The reserves of New York banks decreased \$1,800,000 during the week, owing to purchases of the late bond issue. The surplus reserves is now \$52,220,000, as compared with \$76,000,000 a year ago, and \$4,460,000 over the week. Loans increased \$4,460,000 the past week, specie decreased \$1,551,900, legal tenders increased \$829,200, deposits decreased \$12,535,600 and circulation increased \$69,600.
