In criticism of my valuations for the assessment of the property of the Day son Lumber Company and subsidiary companies, my critic delivers himself in this surprising fashion:-"'As a lawyer your correspondent should kno that railways and equipment are by the assessment law exempt from taxation." I am extremely loath to believe that such words could have emanated from a writer, himself a lawyer and for a long time a prominent county officer.

The section in the Assessment Act to which "Elector" evidently refers provides exemption for "tile unad olling stock, bed, track, wharves, station houses, buildings and plant used exclusively for the purposes of any railway either in course of construction or in operation, exempted inder the authority of any act passed


