- (a) Twigs dark brown, smooth medium size.

  European Bird Cherry, (Cerasus padus.)
- (b) Twigs chocolate brown, ridged, quite crooked, medium size.

Purple Leafed Plum, (Prunus)

- (c) Twigs slaty brown, very slender and smooth.

  Choke Cherry, (Prunus Virginiana.
- (d) Twigs light brown with a greyish cast. Very small (fine) and much branched, smooth.

  Spiraea, (Spiraea vanhouteii.)
- (e) Twigs fine, ridged.

  Dwarf Weeping Cherry, (Prunus Cerasus.)
- Buds light brown, round leaf scars, small round buds. Catalpa, (Catalpa speciosa.)
   Bud scales black or very dark brown, no hairs.

Mountain Ash, (Pyrus Americana.)

- D. Buds sessile, apparently only one bud scale, which is large; twigs are very fine and much branched.
- Siberian Pea Tree, (Caragana)

  E. Buds sessile, without scales, bud only pointed and very hairy.

  Branches and twigs smooth, color dark brown.
