THE MARCHIONESS OF QUEENSBERRY

She Protests Against the Hanging of Poole and O'Donnell—The Manchester Martyrs.

LONDON, Dec. 11.—The Marchioness of Queensberry has sent the following letter to the London *Univers*, as a protest against the "hanging policy" of the English Government:—

TO THE EDITOR OF THE UNIVERS.

Sir,—If there is a petition preparing in behalf of Poole I would like to put my name to it. I cannot myself believe him to be guilty more than I do O'Donnell. Two days ago was the anniversary of the Manchester Martyrdom. There was in that trial a broken-down verdict in the case of Shore and Maguire, they were reprieved, but strange to say, that although Shore in the dock proudly gloried in the fact that he participated in the rescue, he was liberated, and his companions were executed. The artisans and honest-hearted English workmen strove to save these noble three; in crowded meetings they adopted memorials to the Government protesting against their execution, for a very large portion of the public knew that those men had not had a fair trial, and we know in what manner it was that Maguire was sentenced to death, witnesses one after another deliberately swearing that they saw him taking a prominent part in the rescue, although he did not know Colonel Kelly, and never saw him nor heard of him, I believe, until arrested for assisting in his liberation. Yet the horrible fact stands that he and Shore were with the other three condemned to die. Seven witnesses swore positively to having seen Maguire breaking open the van, and I believe they even repeated "words which he spoke" whilst he was thus engaged. Seven perjured witnesses! On the evidence, too, of such like persons, did the three noble martyrs die. No one can bring back these men, or others who have died innocent of the charges against them; the cry cannot be restored to his mother, nor the son to a widowed mother and his poor little children, nor a noble-hearted son to an old, broken-hearted father! 'Tis past; yet I know, alas! that it still has to be accounted for. I write not to judge—God forbid—but to warn against the danger of accepting oaths and evidence from men who are not only avowed enemies of the prisoner, but who neither know nor fear the God whom they invoke, and who acknowledge themselves to have been engaged in the arrangements for the murdering of their brother. It is truly awful to think that a man's life or woman's honor is to be imperilled at the word of such men, or that of youths, children, women, who have "no fear of God before their eyes," and who (as some themselves have said to me) would "swear anything to gain their end," whatever it may be. Surely, in such a solemn and tremendous work as the taking away of life, we should, to say the least, have the clear testimony of trustworthy ones as witnesses to a deed for which our brother has to die. If we were in Poole's place, should we not desire that others would set in this way to us or our children or belongings? Such is the golden rule, and if the blessed teaching of the greatest Friend of man was attended to, we should see justice and mercy and love to our neighbor reigning, whilst desolation and misery, hatred and terrible revenge, with all their attendants, would be found no more.—I remain, Sir, yours faithfully,

It was examined by the family doctor, who said the child could not live, but just two weeks after the leg dropped off at the knee, and, strange to say, the wound has healed up and the child is doing well without the aid of a doctor.

AGRICULTURE IN ONTARIO.

TORONTO, Dec. 11.—A summary of the report of the Bureau of Industries has been published, from which we take the following extracts.—There is a large surplus of hay and clover in the country, the total crop exceeding last season's by 2,036,793 tons. Last year the area under crop was 1,826,890 acres, and the average yield 1.14 tons per acre; this year the area was 2,359,521 acres, and the average yield 1.75 tons. The rains of May, June and July delayed the seasonable planting of potatoes and hindered the preparation of the ground for other roots. The subsequent drought caused the land to bake, and autumn growth was slow. Carrots and mangolds, which go deep into the soil, suffered least; but turnips were almost everywhere stunted, and the average produce per acre is 150 bushels less than last year. The failure of fruit has been general throughout the Province. The show of apple blossoms was full of promise, notwithstanding that this was the off year for bearing, but the cold winds and rains which prevailed throughout May and on into June blasted the prospect. A small surplus of peaches was produced in the Niagara peninsula and along the lake shore in Norfolk. Cherries were scarce and almost worthless. The plum crop was large, but the quality was injured by the curculio, blight and the September frost. Black-knot is rapidly destroying the plum and cherry orchards. Grapes ripened slowly, owing to continued low temperature in August and September, and were damaged by a total loss having been on down by frost. The settlement of a new market for horses, and the effort they are making to supply the demand is shown by the noticeable increase in the return of sheep show a diminution of some 43,400; wholly in the fine-wooled breeds, however, there being an increase in the coarse-wooled breeds of 18,463. A large surplus of hogs is reported, especially in the western counties of the province, but the failure of the corn and pea crops there has discouraged the production of pork. A smaller area of fall wheat has been sown than last year, and owing to the autumn drought the ground at seed time was hard and lumpy. The return of dairy butter made in the Province last year is incomplete, many farmers being unable to give their produce as asked for in the schedule sent out. The quantity as given is 34,406,114 lbs., but the total is probably one-third more.
