HOMEOPATHY IN HOLLAND.

That there is still no chair of homeopathy at any of our universities is, says De Standaard owing 1. The fear of competition. A change can only be expected in this state of things when a Minister (in charge of Public Instruction) shall appear who will have the courage to allow himself to be enlightened in respect to the position of homeopathy in other countries, either by personal examination of the question, or by enlisting the services of our consuls and diplomatic agents.

At present, the Government takes party view in a purely scientific que-tien, from which arises the following disadvantage :- One who applies himself, in this country, to homeopathy is comforted with the thought that he will have a double amount of work in his studies. He must first qualify in the usual manner as an allopathic physician, and, by an examination, acquire the academic right to practice his Then he must go to Budaprofession. Pesth or America for the special purpose of completing his homeopathic studies, and for that must obtain quite a new library. If he roturns here afterwards, then he

misses all the official support accorded to allopathy. He finds no good dispensing chemist. He finds no hospital. He has trouble in the matter of consultation with other doctors. He is generally looked at askance by his conferes.

According to Dr Star doard, it I as been experimentally proven that medicinal power of the highest order lies hidden in homeopathy, although the journal also gives its meed of praise to allopathy looked at from its own standpoint. All it would protest against is partiality on the part of the Government. "It is only a just and equitable demand that the Government begin with, at least, one university, and place in it a homeopathic faculty, alongside of the allopathic faculty. And this could the more readily be done since the homeopathic school introdures no preumedical science, but only its own therapeutics or method of treatment."

As an example, De Standaard instances America, which possesses not less than ten homeopathic faculties, with homeopathic hospitals, having not less than 1,560 students, while from these colleges 7,868 doctors have already taken their degree.

And finally, Dr Standaard gives prominence to the fact that to give homeopathy, such recognition as is claimed is also in the interest of the lower classes, inasmuch as the homeopathic method of cure does not demand one-touth the cost of the allopathic.—Leid-ch Dughlad.
