Whereupon, Mr. Prudham, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, informed the House, That His Excellency the Governor General, having been informed of the subject-matter of the said proposed Resolution, recommends it to the House.

Resolved, That the House do go into Committee of the Whole at the next sitting of the House to consider the said proposed Resolution.

The House then resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. George, seconded by Mr. Gauthier (Lac-Saint-Jean):—

That the following Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General of Canada:—

To His Excellency the Right Honourable Vincent Massey, Member of the Order of the Companions of Honour, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada.

## MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:

We, Her Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Commons of Canada, in Parliament assembled, beg leave to offer our humble thanks to Your Excellency for the gracious Speech which Your Excellency has addressed to both Houses of Parliament.

And the Debate still continuing;

Mr. Fair, seconded by Mr. Quelch, moved in amendment thereto:—That the following be added to the Address:

"We regret that Your Excellency's Advisers have failed:

- (a) To provide adequate inducements for the possible and essential expansion in the production of foods in Canada, and
- (b) To provide for the economic marketing and distribution of whatever part of our food production may become surplus."

And the question being proposed;

Mr. Bryce, seconded by Mr. Knight, moved in amendment thereto:—That the amendment be amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:

"(c) To establish a federal authority to deal with meat and with dairy products during the present emergency, with power to establish floor prices for producers, to protect consumers by control of retail prices, and to arrange for the equitable distribution of such products during the said emergency."

And a Debate arising thereon, and continuing; the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Knowles, adjourned.

On motion of Mr. Fournier (Hull), the House then adjourned at 10.50 o'clock, p.m., until Monday next at three o'clock, p.m.
