

Remarks.

These birds were found only on one small island off the west coast of Greenland, in lat. $75^{\circ}\frac{1}{2}$ N. It appears that they are a new species of gull; and I understand that the Linnaean Society has resolved to call them the Sabine Gull, in honour of Captain Sabine, of the Royal Artillery, who accompanied the late expedition.

Remarks.

The whale which the Isabella's boats and ours killed, was only 46 feet long. I believe their average length is 50 feet.

The fishermen never disturb this species of whale on account of its having but very little blubber on it.

We saw an immense number of these animals, chiefly among the ice, on which they frequently basked.

These fish must be pretty numerous in Baffin's Bay; for all the natives of that coast whom we saw had spears made of their horns.
