On the 13th of July, the general gave orders, that the New York regiment; the New Jersey regiment; the Rhode Island regiment; Col. Dotey's regiment of Massachuset's-Bay Troops, and a detachment from the train of artillery should repair to Schenectady, there to observe such orders and directions, as they should receive from the commanding officer at that post.

The New York regiment left Fort William-Henry on the 14th of July, and was followed in regular succession, by the other Troops on the 15th, 16th, 17th and 18th Instant. And on the 24th Instant, the whole assembled at Schenectady.

A few days preceding our arrival at Schenectady, Major Arbuthnot, of Col. Williams's regiment, of Boston Troops, who were posted here, had been order'd with a command of 300 men to Fort Harkemer, to join the troops at that post, under the command of Lieutenant Col. Clinton, of the New York regiment, who was
