"The system may have faults—this I shall not de-"ny. Genius may fashion to itself, a more perfect " and blameless erection—but, Sir, I have no wish to " see speculative Genius displaying its energies by "raising a new system upon the ruins of one which "has existed for a thousand years. To the eye it " seems strangely put together-but we know it "works well; and let us not venture to disturb the "harmony of its present movements, for an imagi-" nary improvement, which time has not approved " or experience sanctioned. *"
