the Union Pacific Railroad, including a line of telegraph, preliminary surveys, rolling stock, and interest, has given an average of 34,977 dols., or only about \pounds 7,000, though the line presented greater difficulties than that through British North America.

The above distances may also be classed in three categories, as regards the nature of the soil and country traversed, viz. :---

- 1. Level, rich, arable country.
- 2. Rolling country, less fertile.
- 3. Poor, mountainous, and timbered.
