States Senate of its constitutional prerogative. A misunderstanding. The treaty advocates, however, felt that there had been a misunderstanding of the scope of the treaty by the two governments.

In Open Senate. In view of their importance it is intimated that a motion may be made to reframe them in open senate, an almost unprecedented procedure.

Article I—All differences hereafter arising between the high contracting parties, which have not been possible to adjust by diplomacy, relating to international matters in which the high contracting parties are concerned by virtue of a claim of right made by one of the parties, under treaty or otherwise, and which are justifiable in their nature by reason of being susceptible of decision by the application of the principles of law or equity, shall be submitted to the permanent court of arbitration established at The Hague by the convention of Oct. 18, 1907, or by some other tribunal as may be decided in each case by special agreement.

Article II. The high contracting parties do further agree to institute also as occasion arises and as hereinafter provided, a joint high commission of inquiry to consider and report on the request of either party, which shall be referred, for impartial and conscientious investigation, any controversy between the parties within the scope above mentioned, and excepting articles 53 and 54 of such convention, shall govern the arbitration proceedings to be taken under this treaty.

Article III. The joint high commission of inquiry, instituted in each case as provided for in Article II, is authorized to examine into and report upon the particular questions or matters referred to it, for the purpose of facilitating the solution of disputes by elucidating the facts and to define the points in controversy.

Article IV. The commission shall be composed of three members, one of whom shall be designated by each of the high contracting parties, and the commission may fix such times and places for its meetings as may be necessary, subject at all times to special call or direction of the two governments.
