Mushrooms.—Mushrooms were the feature of the wholesale market yesterday. Only a limited quantity came in early in the day, and they opened at \$3.50 per 11-quart basket, and advanced to \$4.00 later that the price took a downward slide, and they closed very, very weak at \$1.50 per 11-quart basket, the bulk selling at \$1.00 per 11-quart, and 75¢ per 12 to \$1 per six-quart.

Plums.—Plums have the best demand of any of the fruits, selling at 45¢ to 60¢ per quart, and 75¢ to \$1 per 11-quart flat, and \$1 to \$1.85 per 11-quart leno. The prune plums are beginning to come in, and are now sold selling at 65¢ to 75¢ per six-quart flat.

Cantaloupes.—There have been so many low-grade cantaloupes shipped in lately that the better ones have been sold at 10¢ to 15¢ per six-quart flat.
