BRITISH AND COLONIES

Sir Charles Dilke on Preferential Trade Idea. THREW COLD WATER ON IT

In an Address Before the Fabian Society in London Last Night.

Granting Special Advantages to the Colonies Would Benefit One-Fourth of the Trade of Britain and be Detrimental to Three-Fourths—The Problem of Defence Still the Most Vital One—The Disaster to General Westmacott's Force to be Requiring Into-Cable News.

London, Nov. 12.—Sir Charles Dilke, Radical member of Parliament for the Forest of Dean, addressing the Fabian Society in this city this evening, with reference to the difficulties of welding the Empire into a working whole, said:

It must be remembered that granting special advantages to the colonies would benefit one-fourth of our trade, but be detrimental to three-fourths. To give an advantage to Canadian wheat would mean imposing a duty on American and Argentine wheat...
