Professor Lachambre, Who Built the Balloon, Thinks He May Have Reached the Pole.

HAD PROVISIONS FOR THREE YEARS

Sledges and Boats Now on the Balloon and the Professor is Not Alarmed.

Stockholm, Jan. 17.—Professor Lachambre, the aeronaut who made the balloon in which his friend Andre had been killed, on July 1, 1897, on his journey to the North Pole, has assured the anxious relatives and friends of the Scandinavian explorer that he does not despair of seeing Andre again, despite the fact that the balloon he had used has perished. In a letter to Andre's father he says: "I am convinced that the balloon on the further side of it, and that he is still alive. He has been in the balloon for three years, and he has plenty of provisions for three years more. Andre, it may be remembered, had two companions, a Swede, named Strindberg and Pruenkel.
