Montreal, May 30.—The plumbers strike is practically at an end, thru the energetic efforts of the Conference Con mittees. Messrs. W. J. McGuire & Co. contractors for the new Montreal Bank and large employers of plumbers and steamfitters, have signed the union scale, and their men returned to work scale, and their men returned to work at once. The following firms, however, have not yet signed: Ald. Joseph Lamarche, Ogilvie Bros., M. Walsh, John Date and Gordon & Egan. As there are now only thirty men out, the officials of the union are of the opinion these firms will all have signed by tomorrow evening, and the struggle will be finally ended.

A POOL TO PUT UP THE STOCK Of the Montreal Power Company is Said to Be Formed.

Montreal, May 30.-The Montreal Light, Heat and Power Company stock will be listed on the New York Stock Exchange in two weeks time, and it is generally understood that a pool has generally understood that a pool has been formed to put up the stock. The annual report out to-day shows the gross return of the company, amounting to \$1,760,285.19, and the net profits to \$729,721.87, being 5 per cent. on the capital on which the company had to pay dividends during the year. Out of the net profits there have been declared four quarterly dividends of 1 per cent. each, amounting to \$587,968.73, leaving a balance of \$141,753.14 which has been placed to the credit of surplus account.




