Port Arthur, Nov. 24 .- (Special.) -With the prospect of an early election for the Federal House, much interest is being manifested in New Ontario as to the selection of a candidate to represent West Algoma. In the Liberal anks there seems to be some dissatisaction at Port Arthur, Fort William nd Rat Portage. Each want to seoure the nomination of the party for local man. Cameron, M.L.A., is talked of as the choice of the party at Rat Portage, and Jas. Conmee. M. L.A., is said to be looking for the nomination at Port Arthur. It is stated there that the member from the Port Arthur and Rainy River district fears for the life of the Liberals in the local legislature, and he is quite willing to stand for the Dominion House. There is also a rumor that Clifford Sifton will be requested to accept the nomination and run for the district. With the Minister of the Interior on the Liberal ticket, it would settle the trouble which is now commencing to brew in the Liberal ranks.

Mayor Claret, one of the most pronounced municipal ownership chief magistrates in Ontario, has been waited upon by the ratepayers of Port Arthur and requested to accept the office of chief magistrate for a second term. If he decides to stand there will be no opposition, as he has during the past year entrenched himself so highly in public opinion that he could not be defeated. Mayor Claret will advocate the development of all the power practicable on Current River, some 20,000 horse power, by the corporation, and he estimates that, with this harnessed, within ten years the tax rate of Port Arthur would be diminished. The town's electrical power now being developed is all being disposed of, and new industries are applying for a supply.

The C. P. R. Co. are preparing to handle a large bulk of their export grain by an all-rail route this winter. Commencing on Dec. 1, 200 cars a day will be sent east to the seaboard by the Canadian Pacific. The company is offering a special rail and ocean rate to England over their line of railway and steamships, which will no doubt taken advantage of by the shippers. The grain will be hauled to St. John, N.B., where it will be loaded into the vessels. Already a large shipment has been made from King's elevator at this place to Europe via this route.

The Princeton and Sanona were the only two to load at Port Arthur, taking about 400,000 bushels to Buffalo. With the Canadian bottoms' in commission, all the grain is shiped almost entirely to Europe, thru Canadian ports, thus cutting off the large export of Canadian grain via
