TESTING A QUACK

Highly Amusing Scene in a German Court of Law.

Berlin, March 6.—The self-styled infallible magnetic doctor, Schroeter, of Berlin, who is on trial as a quack, was tested by the judge, jury and medical experts to-day. He displayed astounding proof of his exceeding fallibility.

As soon as the trial was resumed this morning Schroeter was confronted with three patients from the Tislat infirmary who had been carefully examined by medical experts.

Schroeter felt their heads, looked into their eyes, held their hands, closed his own eyes, opened them and finally brought a powerful magnifying glass into operation for examining their eyes again and again.

"The judge started the fun, and at once began questioning Schroeter. "Did you feel the pulse of the first patient?" he asked. "No, but I found," said Schroeter, "for a certainty that he has no disease of the heart or the lungs."

"Gentlemen," he asked, "what is the patient's illness?" "He is suffering from inflammation of the lungs," was the unanimous reply.

"What is wrong with him?" asked the judge. "I can find nothing wrong with him," replied Schroeter.

"The medical experts gave his complaint as an abscess of the lung," said the judge. "I have," he said, "examined Schroeter, and I have noticed the signs of an unmistakable abscess—reflected in his eyes."

"On the left," said the prisoner. "On the right," answered the medical experts in unison.

After Schroeter had given another specimen of his quackery in the eyes of the jury, the trial was adjourned.

Two magnetic doctors were yesterday sentenced to Berlin for criminal quackery. One was given forty days, and the other twenty days' imprisonment.
