Enormous Price Paid For Shire in England

Another remarkable auction sale of draught horses, indicative of a bright future for this branch of horse-breeding, is reported from England. Thirty-seven Shires, composing the entire stud of the late Leopold Salomans of Dorking, brought \$61,925, an average of \$1673.

The nine stallions made an average of \$4030, and one of them, Norbury Menestrel, went to \$15,750, while another, King of Dorking, by Looking Forest King, went to \$10,000. Norbury Menestrel is the sire of many winners at the London Shire Horse Show, and the high price for which he was sold is attributed largely to his success in the show ring. It was said that he had earned about \$6000 a year in the stud.

At the recent sale of the late Lord Rothschild's Trine Park stud, when nearly fifty Shires made an average of about \$2500 each, it was noticeable that the show ring winners, the sires and dams of winners and the offspring of winners, were the ones that brought the highest prices.
