CLARKE

Reports 11 conversions, \$50 raised for missionary purposes, 4 congregations, and general prosperity.

MUSKOKA

Reports appointments in Muskoka, Morrison, Draper, McAulcy and Watt; 1 local preacher, a membership of 49, a regularly constituted Quarterly Board, and two churches in course of crection. The prospects financially and splittually are encouraging.

UXBRIDGE

Was set apart as a separate charge last year, and will require much labor ere it become self-sustaining.

ELMA

Has eight appointments in Elma, Maryboro and Wallace. We have a parsonage and three respectable churches. Spiritually the cause is at present low.

KINCARDINE

Is situated in a good section of the country; has 72 members, and is in a good condition, though serious obstacles have hindered the work in the past. There have been 16 conversions during the year.

TEESWATER,

In Culcross and Kinloss, has passed through a year of prosperity. Conversions, 45; membership, 103; missionary money raised, \$104. All claims met. This work will soon be classed amongst self-sustaining circuits.

MELANCTHON

Contains 6 appointments and 75 members. There are two churches and a parsonage. It is just now in a state when it is more important than ever before that it should be efficiently supplied. Whereas in the past the residents have been, with few exceptions, transient ones, it is now being occupied by land owners, so that what is gained now may be kept, not being so liable to remove.
