#### TOWN PLANNING

The town planning commission of St. John will ask the legislature to approve of the limits of an area to be comprised in the scheme for a Greater St. John.

This is the first step toward town planning, and after it has been taken Mr. Thomas Adams estimates that it will Thomas Adams estimates that it will take two or three years to draw up a comprehensive and satisfactory town plan. The advantage of having the limits of the area fixed is that thereafter its of the area fixed is that thereafter must yield, to their demand. its of the area fixed is that thereafter no subdivision could be developed within it without first consulting the commission. It is not proposed to enter upon any large immediate expenditure in connection with the scheme. Mr. in connection with the scheme. Mr. They are not delivering the goods. Adams recommends a moderate fixed appropriation for each year, so that the work may be continuously carried on without placing a heavy burden upon

the taxpayers.

The visit of Mr. Adams has borne good fruit, and it may fairly be assumed that the town planning commission will press forward the establishment of will press forward the establishment of the area of Greater St. John, and make provision for a beginning of the preparation of the plan as soon as legislative authority has been secured.

One of the significant statements made by the town planning expert was that regarding the width of streets. He made it perfectly clear that it is not only unnecessary but very near economy.

Where a road sixty feet wide or even more might be desirable for a main artery in a large city an eighteen foot roadway might serve for a side street with little traffic, where the houses would not be jammed up against the street nor crowded too closely together.


