British United Press. GENEVA, Sept. 18—Soviet Russia is preparing to block European Se-curity Pact negotiations, if she is not permitted to participate in them, British United Press learns. Foreign Minister Skryznski, of Poland, has departed from Geneva for Warsaw, where he will meet George T. Chitcherin, Soviet Foreign Minister, Saturday. It is understood that the latter will propose some form of Security Pact to Poland, per haps suggesting that the Allies and Germany admit the Soviet to the negotiations which are to begin be tween them in October.
