THREE OTHERS ARE SLAIN WITH FORMER BANDIT

Villa Driving Auto When Fired on by Assassins

Secretary and Two of Bodyguard Fall With Chief as Shots Ring Out From an Ambuscade—Three of the Slayers Reported Arrested

(Canadian Press.) Mexico City, July 21.—General Francisco Villa, one-time noted bandit leader, and his secretary, Colonel Miguel Trillo and two of Villa's escort were assassinated in an ambuscade early yesterday morning on the outskirts of Parral, in the state of Chihuahua. About a half dozen men comprised the band of assassins. They fired upon Villa and his men from a house they

were passing.

Villa was driving an automobile on the way to Guanajuato when he was fired upon. Immediately the news of the assassination reached here, orders were sent to scour the countryside ad-lacent to the ambuscade in an endeavon to round up the guilty persons. The body of Villa is lying in the City Hall at Parral where thousands of persons have viewed it. President Obregon has ordered an investigation into the as-

Villa's first great victory against the Huerta troops was at Ojinaga. After the battle, 4,000 men and eight generals of the Federal army took refuge in als of the Federal army took renige in the United States and were interned. In other fights, including San Pedro, de las Colonies, Paredon and Torreon, Villa was also triumphant. Then came an estrangement between Villa and Carranza, and when the latter made his triumphal entry into Mexico City, following the retirement of Huerta, the bandit leader declared war upon the new President. Villa had been one of the independent chiefs who had made and formulated the plan of Guadalupe which made Carranza first chief dalupe which made Carranza first chies of the Constitutionalist forces.

With Emilio Zapata, another bandit chieftain opposed to Huerto, Villa made common cause. The two occupied Mexico City with their troops, forcing Carranza's retirement to Vera Cruz. General Alvaro Obregon, later successor to de la Huerta in the Presidency, and loyal to Carranza, led an army out to meet them. At Celaya, Irapuato and Cilao he defeated the Villa-Zapata forces. In those battles, Obregon lost an arm and Villa lost his prestige a sa commander. The Villa prestige a sa commander. The Villa and Zapata followers were dispersed. One disaster followed another and Villa

One disaster followed another and Villa retreataed across the mounthains to Sonora, where he joined forces with the Yajui chieftain Urbalejo.

In the years that followed, and up to the time of the Columbus, N. M., raid, Villa's influence as a military leader steadily waned. Defections from Villa's ranks continued, many of his generals leaving him and accepting the amnesty of the Carranza government. Villa sent his wife across the border and with only a few hundred men resumed the bandit raids for which in earlier years he had been notorious.

Then came the overthrow of the Car-Then came the overthrow of the Carranza regime, the rise of the de la Huerta Provisional Government and the election of Abregon. Obregon had proved Villa's master in the field. On May 27, 1920, three Federal forces started out to capture Villa and the following July, as 8,000 men were closing in on him he agreed to a nagmising in on him, he agreed to a narmistice and surrendered to General Eugenio Martinez at Sabinas, practically on his own terms.



today, and they are speculation or banditry," a bearded old civil engineer told the writer while riding on the train from Moscow to Petrograd the other day.

This engineer, who occupies an important post with the state railway administration, said that he earned a salary which is the equivalent of about \$15 a month. His son, who is a speculator and admittedly not overscrupulous in the way he turns his profits, makes fifty times that amount.

"Our salaries are so low in the state service that no ambitious young man, particularly if he is married, can reconcile himself to acepting them. Therefore, to win a fortune or live comfortably, he must become one of that hated class in Russia and elsewhere—a speculator. The only other lucrative profession is that of a bandit, or hold-up man.

"People who blame the speculators forget that it probably will be they, with their quickly secured profits and faculty of taking long chances, who will ultimately build up Russia. It is not a long cry from speculating in merchandise to taking a chance on building a railroad or developing a mine. They are the pioneers, breaking


