AMERICAN WRITER

KILLED BY GERMAN Paul De Mott, of Paterson, N. J., Victim of "Murder by Solidarity."

Berlin, April 16—An official announcement made in the case of Paul De Mott, of Paterson, N. J., said to have been an American citizen, who was killed recently at Wesel, near the Ruhr region, states that he was shot dead while attempting to escape from military arrest.

De Mott, who was twenty-two years old, was taken prisoner by government troops, near Dinslaken, southeast of Wesel, early last week, charged with being in possession of arms and aiding in the rebellion. He was caught in company with members of the Red Army, according to the government statement.

The whereabouts of De Mott since his arrest had not been known here, although he was generally believed to be safe, despite the fact that he was reported sentenced to death by a military court. This belief was due to the government's declaration, reiterated only last Saturday, that no death warrants would be issued unless approved by President Ebert.

A WASHINGTON HEARING ON THE PULPWOOD MATTER

Washington, April 16—Chairman Porter of the house foreign affairs committee announced yesterday that a hearing would be held on April 26 on a senate resolution authorizing appointment of an American commission to confer with Canadian government officials regarding restrictions placed on the export of pulpwood to the United States.

Representative Christopheron, Republican, South Dakota, introduced a resolution yesterday by which Attorney-General Palmer would be directed to conduct a "sweeping and thorough" investigation into the manufacture, sale and distribution of print paper and "to institute criminal proceedings against all who have violated the law or who are guilty of profiting."

TWO KILLED IN FIGHT OF NEGROES AND DETECTIVES

Concordville, Pa., April 16—Two men were killed and three others wounded in the Baltimore & Ohio railroad yard here last night when railroad detectives engaged in a fight with five negroes who some time ago threatened to "get" the detectives.

Ben Kohrt, thirty-five years, of this place, one of the detectives, was killed instantly when a bullet struck him in the chest. James Wright, negro, of Johnstown, Pa., died a few minutes after being wounded. The three wounded were negroes.

SAYS THAT COMPULSORY EDUCATION IS NOT ADVISABLE IN QUEBEC

Montreal, April 16—Compulsory education was not advisable in the province of Quebec and instead of attempting to pass such a law, efforts should be directed towards removing the causes which militate against school attendance and against a more satisfactory scholastic record, was a plea made by Amédée Monette, M. L. A., before the Junior Liberal Association last night. Fernand Rinfret, victor in the recent by-election in St. James division, was the guest of honor.

PLUNDERERS CAUSED DAMAGE OF MILLIONS

Berlin, April 16—Damage caused by the communists plundering the Ruhr district is estimated for Duisburg at 18,000,000 marks; Essen, 10,000,000 marks, and Dortmund 4,000,000 marks.

HUDSON BAY LANDS

Calgary, April 16—Local veterans decided not to picket the land settlement office yesterday as a protest against the sale of Hudson Bay lands by the government. Twenty-four parcels of land were sold, valued at \$75,000. Land was sold to returned soldiers.

Quebec School Taxes

Quebec, April 16—(Canadian Press)—The Quebec Protestant school board has notified the city council that it will require \$200 for school purposes this year. This will not necessitate any increase in the tax rate. It is now eighty cents per \$100.

The Catholic school tax will be increased from fifty-five to sixty cents, as it was required for Catholic school purposes is \$591,059.17.

Quebec Bond Sale

It was decided by the civic finance committee here last night to sell on the local market at par \$800,000 in City of Quebec five-year bonds bearing six per cent interest. They will be put on sale on May 1, in denominations of \$100, \$500 and \$1,000.

Soldier Found Drowned

Quebec, April 16—The body of Joseph Primard, aged 37, a returned soldier, found drowned in the Louie docks here on Wednesday, was identified yesterday. He had been missing since last November.
