TRUSTS AND THE PEOPLE. The following extract from the speech in parliament at Ottawa, made last week by Mr. Alphonse Verreuil, who represents organized labor, is of very general interest.

"I can tell you, Mr. Speaker, that there is one big question to be decided by the people of this country and that is the question between the people and the trusts. We have come to that stage in our existence where we are confronted with the problems of other countries which solve themselves. The trusts are well satisfied with their victory. Why should they not be? They have seven millions in the cabinet, but they must not forget that the fight between the interests and the people has only just begun.

Mr. Monion of Yamaska took occasion in his speech in parliament to praise Mr. Bourassa. Among other things he said: "Why had Mr. Bourassa left the Liberal party? He began to lose confidence in it."


