WASHINGTON INTEREST IN MEXICAN WARFARE IS GROWING KEENER

Washington, April 18.—The Mexican situation, which has fast approaching a crisis in its international aspect, was the principal subject of consideration at today's cabinet meeting.

It seems almost certain that the problem soon will reach the house. Interest in the situation is keyed to the highest pitch, and border developments brought officials of the state and departments to their desks early today.

FOUR DIED ON VOYAGE HERE

Minus four of her record number of passengers from typhoid and pneumonia, the C. P. R. liner Montezuma, Captain Griffith, from London and Antwerp, arrived this morning with more than 2,600. This is the largest number on any steamer this season.

Typhoid fever resulted in the death of three and pneumonia one, and all were buried at sea. The patients, a steward, the steamer, was taken off at the island suffering from typhoid.
