New York, April 7—A marked curtailment in the buying of automobiles is causing some manufacturers to make sharp cuts in their April production sharp cuts in their April production programme, and if is now considered very unlikely that the output this month will come up to the high record of 367, 485 cars established in March.

One banker who is familiar with the automobile situation said that the decline in sales had gone beyond expectations, but he added that he did not expect any serious results in the industry as a result, provided April production figures and those of the following months were curtailed considerably below preliminary schedules.
