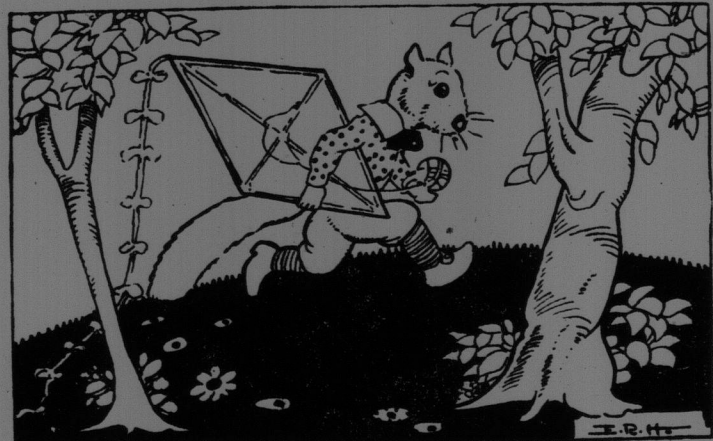

HORSE LOCATES TWO BIG STILLS

Unwittingly Leads Officers to Moonshine Outfit of Its Owner.

Klamath Falls, Ore., June 27.—(United Press).—"Horse sense" was enlisted by liquor sleuths near here, with the result that today two big moonshine stills are not operating, which otherwise would probably be going full tilt.

The stills and the horse belonged to the same man, Roy Tankley, who later pleaded guilty to possessing the stills. "Scotty" Davidson, deputy United States marshal, explained.

Tankley, a son of G. W. Tankley, state prohibition officer, was reported to be moonshining, according to Davidson's story. He had a camp about three miles from Klamath Lake and the officers made their way there. Hours spent in searching, however, revealed no evidence.

Finally one of the agents noticed the old horse grazing nearby. Mounting the animal, Deputy Marshal Lowe started down a trail.

Without any particular purpose, he gave the animal free rein and rode several miles. Suddenly the horse turned from the trail and walked through a clump of bushes. Proceeding a short distance he stopped near two stills.

"And by thunder," said Davidson, "they packed up those stills and brought 'em into camp. It was so much for Tankley. He confessed the whole thing."
