OBJECTS OF THE UNION.

1. The action of a sound Public Opinion, as to the evils of Intemperance, . Jarmons, Lectures, Tracts, and other publications. in the Common and other Schools, and otherwise

training, of the rising veration in Temperance principles.

3. Aiding constituted a verities in explaining and enforcing all Dominion Provincial, and Mun val Liquor Laws; and, when these are objectionable by either error or fect, procuring their amendment. 4. The progressive diminution of the number of Taverns and other

Public Houses for the sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

5. The discouragement of all "treating" in agricultural and commercial transactions; and, generally, "tippling" or drinking at bars, restaurants or hotels.

6. The encouragement of healthful counteractions to the entice-

ments of the ordinary Tavern or Public House.

7. The establishment of Parochial, District, or Congregational

Unions and Temperance Societies, on the basis of this Constitution.

8. Special prayer in Church Courts and at religious services, throughout the bounds of the Church, for the Divine Blessing upon all Temperance Effort.

RULES OF THE UNION.

1. The affairs of the Union shall be managed by a Council, appointed by the Synod at each of its Annual Meetings, which shall divide itself into two Committees, with power to each to add to its number by associating with it Clergymen and laymen from those parts of the Dominion included within the sphere of its operations.

2. The one Committee shall be called the "Western Temperance Union Committee," and shall take, as the sphere of its operations, the Province of Ontario and those parts of the Dominion further West-Headquarters, Toronto; and the other Committee shall be called the "Eastern Temperance Union Committee," and shall take, as the sphere of its operations, the Province of Quebec and those parts of the Dominion further East—Headquarters, Montreal.

3. Each Committee shall appoint its own Chairman, Secretaries and Treasurer, at, or within a month after, the meeting of Synod; shall meet quarterly, or as often as possible; shall have power to adopt By-Laws and Regulations for its own management and work; and generally to concert and carry on measures within the lines laid down in the Constitution and statement of the Objects of the Union.

4. All Donors of Five Dollars annually shall become, in virtue of such donation, members of the Committee, within the sphere of whose

operations he or she resides.
