TRUTHFUL JOHN'S ASSURANCES.

The truthful Ellis in his Carlton speech said—

If the taxation had increased, so had the cost of collecting it. In 1882-3 the revenue from all sources was \$3,000,000.

In 1884 the revenue was \$3,000,000. It cost to collect it, \$1,000,000. In other words, it took \$2,000,000 to collect a revenue of \$3,000,000.

The receipts of the government of Canada from taxes were in 1882-3 \$29,269,000 and in 1889 they were \$31,267,071. The cost of collecting this revenue in 1882-3 was \$1,000,000, and in 1889-90 it was \$1,200,000, an increase of \$200,000 or less than ten per cent of the increase in taxes collected.

The increase of expenditure, of which Mr. Ellis speaks about, wholly arose in the department of railways, public works and the post office, and was made for the public benefit. The items of expenditure in 1882-3 and 1889-90 are given in the following table—
