FIRST EDITION. HURLED TO DEATH.

AN EXCURSION TRAIN CRASHED THROUGH A TREES.

Fifteen persons killed and fifty-eight injured. Some of them fatally. The excursion train crashed through a line of trees on the Kenans & Michigan road, about seven miles from this city, about 10:30 o'clock yesterday morning.

The locality of the accident was a short but high trestle which spans a ravine about twenty feet deep. Over and through this trestle the train plumped, carrying with it the freight of twenty-five or thirty passengers.

The train, which was the regular passenger train from this city for Columbus, N. C., pulled out of the station at 10:15 after 10 o'clock, and consisted of an engine, a combination express and baggage car, and two passenger coaches.

The engine crossed the trestle in safety, and so did the express car, but the forward passenger car, after passing the trestle and reaching the high approach upon the other side, hit the rails and rolled down the steep bank.

As the two cars left the track it seemed as if the occupants united in one grand yell of despair and alarm. The engine, which was hauled in the crash of the cars as they struck the bottom, only to be succeeded by the timber of the woods and the moans of the dying.

To add to the horror of the situation, the heavy timber trunks of the second car, which had rolled upon the overturned car, upon which a few wounded wretches had taken refuge, were crushing those who had just emerged from the interior.

As soon as possible those who had escaped injury, reinforced by the engineer and fireman, began the work of rescue, men being despatched to the nearest telephone office, three miles away, to summon help from this city.

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THIRD EDITION. A BRIDGE ACCIDENT.

ONE HUNDRED PERSONS PLUNGED INTO THE DELAWARE RIVER.

Miraculous escape of many—One killed and two seriously injured.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., July 7.—While the celebration was in progress at Margateville in the Catskills on the former today one hundred men, women and children were plunged into the Delaware river at that point by the breaking of a wooden bridge over which they were crossing.

They fell in a heap into the water below a distance of ten feet. It was a miraculous escape for many. A two-year old child was killed and two persons were injured.
