

making the payment of Annuities,
this being the present course adopted
by Messrs. Agents Ogletree, Martineau,
Snackay, Muckle & Keut, the only
exception to this are in the agencies
of Messrs. McPherson, Pither and
McIntyre, and that in the payment
of Annuities Mr. Pither passes near
all the Reserves in his district and
he considers that it would be to the
interest of the Indians as well as
the Department that payment
should in future be made on the
Reserves; with regard to Mr. McPherson's
Agency that the payments be made
at some central point, at or near
the Reserves: And the only Agency
which would incur much additional
expense in visiting the Reserves is
that of Mr. McIntyre's.
