Dear Sir:

Your letter No. 32389 of October 22nd received and I immediately wired my partner in B.C. for the information required and herewith enclose sketch showing where we want to locate the mill and Boom. Of course the logs will be boomed near the mill and it is our desire to hang a boom between the points indicated so that we can put the logs into the water wherever we happen to be working and float them to the mill and would be pleased to have your authority to do this.

I note in your letter that you have no objection to me erecting a small mill and having the use of such foreshore and booming privileges on this reserve providing it is used solely for the timber on the reserve. Could you not grant the right to bring other logs there and saw them during the life of my license only or any renewals thereof. I do not see what objection the Department would have to this and it would enable me to cut up some other timberland ^{from} which has not a favorable mill site. Kindly give the matter your consideration and give me your reply at your earliest convenience.
