

EARTHQUAKE SHAKES KINGSTON, JAMAICA, WITH GREAT LOSS OF LIFE

Many People Were Killed, Large Numbers Injured--Fire Raging in Devastated Town, Completes the Terrible Disaster--Fear for Safety of Many Tourists.

BOSTON, Jan. 15.—The officials of the United Fruit Company received a cablegram from the company's representative at Port Antonio this afternoon, stating that an earthquake occurred at Kingston on Monday and that part of the city was on fire. No mention was made of any loss of life.
