The subject of the "Christian Visitor" was resumed. After a lengthened discussion, which occupied the whole of the evening, the following Resolution was adopted:—

Whereas, the "Christian Visitor" has been for years recognized as the denominational organ of the associated churches of Eastern and Western N. B. Baptist Associations,—Therefore, Resolved, that said recognition be continued by the Churches of this Association.

Adjourned till Tuesday, 9 A. M. Prayer by Rev. W. M. Edwards.

Met Tuesday morning pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Rev. T. W. Saunders.

Committee on New Churches presented their Report, which was adopted. See Appendix No. 1.

Committee on Home Missions presented their Report. Adopted, and ordered to be printed in the Minutes. Addresses by brethren Harvey, Hickson, Thomson, S. March, Edwards, and Bill. See Appendix, No. 2.

On motion, The Association resolved itself into a Committee of the whole on special business. Rev. G. F. Miles in the Chair.

The following Resolution was then presented, and after considerable debate, was adopted:—

Resolved, that under existing circumstances connected with the Church at Southampton, we cannot recommend its reception; but advise each church to call a combined Council to consult with them.
