ANNUAL MEETING OF ST. JOHN LAW SOCIETY

Judge Armstrong was Chosen President and Charles F. Sanford Secretary-Treasurer for the Coming Year.

The annual meeting of the St. John Law Society took place yesterday afternoon at three o'clock, in the equity court rooms, the president, Amos A. Wilson, K. C., in the chair. Those present were, the president and Judge Armstrong, Recorder Baxter, W. W. Allon, K. C., Dr. Silas Alward, C. P. Sanford, Alex. Baird, T. P. Regan, K. J. McRae, Bowyer S. Smith, H. P. Puddington, J. Roy Campbell, E. T. C. Knowles, R. G. Murray and G. Earle Logan.

It was decided to ask the legislature for power to increase the practitioner's fee from \$10 to \$15 for those barristers practicing five years or over. Mr. Sanford favored suing lawyers who neglected to pay their dues.

The matter of charging outside lawyers for the use of the law library was discussed, and it was decided to leave the matter in the hands of the council. The consensus of opinion seemed to be to have three law libraries in the province directly controlled.

The following were elected members of the council for the ensuing year: Dr. Alward, Recorder Baxter, Judge Armstrong, Attorney General Hazen, Daniel Mullin, K. C., E. T. C. Knowles, A. A. Wilson, K. C., W. A. Ewing, K. C., and J. Roy Campbell. Subsequently the council met and elected Judge Armstrong, president, and Charles F. Sanford, secretary-treasurer.
