FOUR GRABBY FURNACES PUT IN COMMISSION

Special to The Standard, Boston, March 3.—Four furnaces of the Anyox Smelter have again been placed in commission by Grabby Consolidated following partial completion of operations caused by climatic conditions. This was reflected in a lower output for the month of January. Grabby last year ordered equipment for an auxiliary power plant, the installation of which was designed to prevent mid-winter stoppages. The Midvale Steel Co. was unable to make deliveries as desired and a repetition of the previous winter's occurrence developed.

About \$3,700,000 bonds now remain outstanding, having been reduced to this amount by sinking fund operations and purchased for the treasury.
