 Part of Gross Receipts Go  
 to Red Cross.

St. Paul, Minn., April 22—The Min-  
 nesota boxing commission, after a con-  
 ference with Col. J. C. Miller late to-  
 day, voted unanimously to approve  
 the proposed Willard-Fulton fight at  
 St. Paul on July 4th.  
 The commission and Col. Miller
