

COLONEL LEGKIE TO LEAD FLIGHT

First Half of Trans-Canada Flight by Seaplane, Last Leg by Airplane.

Ottawa, Aug. 25.—While no definite choice has been made, it is practically certain that first trans-Canada flight, to be attempted next month under the auspices of the Canadian Air Board, will see Colonel Robert Legkie, who is at present superintending the certificate branch of the C. A. F. as pilot. Colonel Legkie has already made several noteworthy flights, both by airplane and seaplane. It is also understood that the first half of the trip, as far as Winnipeg, will be made by seaplane and the latter half, from the Prairie metropolis to the coast by airplane. The expedition now in that it will take between forty and fifty hours to make the flight.

While the general operations of the Air Board are for exploration, survey and fire protection purposes, the board proposes to test out the commercial possibilities of air transportation. The board itself does not propose to make any commercial ventures, but will supply as much general information on the subject as it is possible to collect, and it will distribute this freely among those interested in the subject matter.

The flight will begin at Halifax.

BOLSHEVİK ARMIES ABOUT DESTROYED

Nothing is Left of Host That Swept Down on Warsaw But 30,000 Fugitives.

Paris, Aug. 25.—The destruction of the Bolshevik armies now may be considered complete, according to advices received here. Of the host which swept down on Warsaw, nothing is left but 30,000 fugitives. The Poles have taken 80,000 prisoners thus far; but what is more important they have captured a great number of guns and materials. It is considered probable that the Soviets employed all their available resources and, in the present condition, Russian industries will take a long time to replace them. Consequently, if the Soviets are able to find effect with which to seek to restore the fortunes of their arms, lack of equipment will make them without military value.

SECURITY PLAN FOR WORLD PEACE

St. Louis, Mo., Aug. 25.—A plea for an international tribunal of justice to secure world order, freedom and peace was made by Viscount Cave in an address tonight before the convention of the American Bar Association.

"It is surely time," the Viscount asserted, "that all civilized nations should combine to set up a court of international law. There can be no effective international law until there is some standing tribunal composed of men of outstanding ability and judicial temper who have the confidence of the civilized world and are authorized on the application of any nation aggrieved, to interpret and administer the law."

Warning against retaliation, Viscount Cave declared revolutionary trouble threatened England but predicted England would "pull through."




