Pending the hearing of this inquiry, the original date of which was adjourned at Mr. Lennon's request so that he could obtain legal counsel, Mr. Lennon was conditionally released from immigration custody. Before the rescheduled inquiry was held, Mr. Lennon withdrew his application and left Canada voluntarily.
