Ed. in Can. Admitted to to the Law Soc of Upper Can., 1834. Served during the Can. Rebellion 1837-8 as Lieut. in 4th Reg., North York Militia. M., 1853, Anna, dau. of Rev. S. B. Ardagh, M. A., Rector of Barrie. Called to the Bar U.C., 1839, and apptd. Judge of the Dist. of Simcoe, 17 Jan., 1843, a
